<p>Working towards Entry 1 Functional skills: Reading/following instructions: Pupils will learn how to find information within a piece of text. Pupils will be able to understand a short piece of text and be able to answer questions about the text. Pupils will learn about verbs and how to include a verb in sentences. Pupils will recognise how to use the personal pronoun 'I'.</p> <p>Entry Level 1: Reading: Following instructions/ Writing: Introduction to writing skills - proper nouns: Pupils will learn how to extract the main information from short statements and explanations. They will learn how to communicate information in words, phrases and simple sentences.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: Reading / SPAG: The pupils will extract the main points of a text and develop their retrieval and inference skills. Pupils will use common conjunctions to write compound sentences. Pupils will learn spelling rules for prefixes and suffixes.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: Use SPAG in different styles of sentences and text: This term pupils will work on understanding how to use new and improve SPAG skills in different styles of sentences and text. Pupils will further understand how to use</p>	<p>Working towards entry 1 in Functional skills: Calculations, the 4 operatives: Pupils will learn about number bonds and techniques on how to support this. Pupils will learn about totalling numbers and how to find a difference between 2 numbers. Pupils will learn different ways of multiplying and the vocabulary that goes with it. Pupils will also learn how to divide numbers and the vocabulary associated with the calculations.</p> <p>Entry Level 1: Calculations - The 4 Operations: Pupils will learn how to calculate number bonds and how to find the total and find the difference of numbers. Pupils will learn different methods of multiplication, and different methods of division.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: The 4 Operations: Pupils will learn how to apply different strategies to add and subtract numbers up to 3 digits. Pupils will develop their understanding of multiplication and division and apply these in both informal and formal written methods.</p> <p>Entry Level 2/3: Addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division with different techniques: This term pupils will combine between E2 and E3 to develop their focus on simple</p>	<p>AIMS Entry 1: Health and safety in a science Laboratory: Pupils will learn what are risks and hazards. Pupils will learn about different types of hazards and where these can be found. Pupils will learn about a science laboratory and what the risks and hazard in there are. Pupils will learn about different symbols and their meaning. Pupils will learn how to work safely in a laboratory and when using equipment.</p> <p>WJEC Entry 2: Food and Health: This term pupils will develop an understanding of the link between food and health. They will learn what foods to eat to have a healthy balanced diet. Pupils will learn about health consequences of making poor food choices. They will learn how to use a range of practical skills to make healthy meals / food items.</p> <p>WJEC Entry 2: Food and health Pupils will explain current nutritional guidelines and be able to identify key nutrients needed by the body. Pupils will explore the results of poor food choices and be able to identify dishes / meals suitable for a range of dietary needs. Pupils will go on to produce of range of healthy meals.</p>	<p>Entry Level 1: Getting about safely: This term pupils will be learning how to stay safe when out and about. Pupils will learn about risks, how they apply to them and how they can keep themselves safe. They will look at common risks such as traffic, strangers and getting lost. Pupils will also learn how to travel safely on public transport and know how to stay safe in school. This will include learning about fire exits and the main school fire alarm and appropriate procedures.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: Accessing Financial Services: Pupils will develop skills and confidence to understand the financial services available in their own locality, what they provide and how they access them.</p> <p>Entry Level 2: To understand financial services: This term pupils will be introduced to the idea of financial services that they may come across throughout their life. Student will learn to understand key things such as credit, borrowing, bank accounts, saving and how to use their money wisely and effectively. Pupils will begin to really focus and understand how they can use financial services for support.</p>

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adjectives effectively to improve their own style of writing. Pupils will look at compound sentences and ensure they develop a secure understanding on how to use this effectively.

Pupils will use conjunctions again this term to use these in their own styles of writing. Finally, pupils will further understand the term "plurals" and how this is used in English writing.

Entry level 3: Reading: Descriptions, Writing: Subject - verb agreements and plurals: Pupils will learn how to identify, understand, and extract the main points in and from a text. They will learn how to respond appropriately to questions on a range of straight forward topics. Pupils will learn how to use grammar correctly, and how to use the consistent tense. They will learn how to use the first, second and third place letters to sequence words in alphabetical order.

Drama

Entry Level 2: Using the body in a dramatic context: Pupils will learn how to identify body movements to portray different characters/roles. They will learn how to use body movements to portray different characters/roles.

addition and subtraction and ensure consistent methods are used throughout this. Pupils will use previous understanding of multiplication and division to support them to further short and long techniques to answer different questions. Pupils will complete KIRFS daily throughout the term with different focuses.

Entry Level 3: Calculations - The four operations: Pupils will learn how to use formal addition and subtraction. They will learn how to use the inverse operations to check answers. Pupils will learn how to find factors and multiples, they will learn how to use multiplication knowledge to explore prime, square and cube numbers. Pupils will learn the short division method and long division method. They will learn how to perform a range of calculations mentally and in the correct order.

WJEC Entry 3: Food and Health: This term pupils will develop an understanding of the link between food and health. Pupils will learn about current nutritional guideline, and what makes up balanced diet. Pupils will learn about health consequences of making poor food choices. They will learn how to plan meals to meet specific dietary needs, and how to adapt recipes to produce healthier meals. Pupils will learn how to make healthy meals / food items.

Level 1: Financial Services and Banking: Pupils will investigate credit, borrowing and saving. They will learn about different ways and places to save and borrow money.

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Humanities

Entry Level 1: A Victorian Britain:

This term pupils will be learning about Queen Victoria, the Industrial Revolution, medicines, and home life during this time. Pupils will explore how different life was then, such as children working hard in factories from a young age. They will also explore the differences in medicine, hygiene and how they might have lived during this era. Pupils will also compare Victorian schooling, toys, and home life to what they experience today.

Entry Level 2: Development issues in local areas: This term pupils will learn about a development or issue that has affected a local area in the past. Pupils will learn how to use historical sources to find out about a local development or issue in the past. Pupils will learn how Marget Thatcher was in power and how that had an impact on their local school area. Furthermore, Pupils will analyse World War 1 and how that impacted The United Kingdom.

Entry Level 2 and 3: Responding to a major tectonic event: Pupils will learn that there are a range of tectonic events and that certain areas of the world are vulnerable to these events. They will learn how a tectonic event may impact on people's health and wellbeing and the infrastructure and economy of the area

Hospitality

Level 1: Basic food preparation and cooking:

Pupils will explore the principal methods of cooking. Pupils will be able to prepare, cook and present dishes, safely and hygienically, using various cooking methods. Pupils will be able to ensure they keep work areas clean and hygienic when preparing food. Pupils will review their performance when cooking and be able to make suggestions for future improvements.

Customer service, retail, and tourism

Entry level 3: UK tourist destinations:

Pupils will learn about visitors to UK tourist destination. They will learn what motivates people to become tourists in different UK destinations. Pupils will also learn what motivates people who live outside the UK to visit UK tourist destinations. They will know what types of accommodation are available to visitors to UK tourist destinations.

ICT

Entry Level 1: Features of a computer

This term pupils will be learning about the main features of a computer and how they work. Pupils will explore basic parts and their function, and how everything works together. Pupils will become familiar with a keyboard, mouse and identify how to use these devices safely. We will also look at health and safety when it comes to using computer equipment such as correct posture and tucking away exposed wires.

Entry Level 2: Computer Safe Practices:

The pupils will learn about different practices that keep them safe when using ICT. Pupils will be introduced to a variety of safety problems that may exist in ICT. Pupils will learn about people that can help when they have a problem with ICT.

Entry Level 2: Interacting with ICT for a purpose & follow recommended safe practices: This term pupils will focus on interacting with ICT for a purpose & follow recommended safe practices - minimise physical stress and understand the need to stay safe. Pupils will continue to develop their ICT skills to keep safe online and improve their overall ICT knowledge.

Entry Level 3: Computer Safe Practices:

The pupils will learn about different practices that keep them safe when using

Pupils will learn how to plan ideas for a painting or picture and what materials will be best to use. Pupils will learn the skills to evaluate their own work and how best to improve the work.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Photography</p> <p>Level 1: Light - This term pupils will be looking at how we can use light in photography and how it impacts our images. Pupils will take part in light practical sessions where they learn how to use manual mode. They will also learn how to use a tripod and use this in conjunction with the manual mode. Pupils will also be learning further skills in terms of body positioning and angles and understand how this impacts our final images. Practical sessions will include light, blacklight and UV portraits.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Digital Media</p> <p>Entry Level 3: Introduction to digital technology: This term pupils in this component are introduced to digital technology, including digital audio, video, and photography. They will also look at possible career opportunities for those with digital technology experience. Pupils will further investigate the positives and negatives of digital technology and decide the best way digital media can be effective to the public.</p> <p>Entry Level 3: Digital Lifestyle: Pupils will continue learning about our digital lifestyle this term. They will move on from speech technology and sound conversion to look at digital photography, the purpose of editing and the many careers available to them in digital media, IT and computing.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">RSE</p> <p>My body: This term pupils will learn about gender identity. They will also learn more in depth information about puberty and how puberty can occur at different ages depending on the individual, pupils will learn about the importance of puberty and the impact it has on the body and emotions. Pupils will learn about hormones and how they are involved in puberty, regulating the menstrual cycle, contraception and fertility treatments. Pupils will learn about the menstrual cycle and the menopause, they will learn what the menstrual cycle and what the menopause means, including the impact they have on the human body. Pupils will also learn about body images and know what a healthy and unhealthy body image is, they will learn about what factors can impact an individual's body image.</p>
