

Curriculum Map - Term 5

14 - 16



English/Drama

Ascot: Phonics, communication and interaction: Pupils will continue to work on phonics, word and sentence structure. Pupils will look at how words are spelt and use key strategies to help with spellings. Pupils will learn how communication can help with English activities and other lessons.

Entry Level 1: Writing: Pupils will learn how to punctuate simple sentences with handwriting which can be easily read. They will learn how to form all letters of the alphabet correctly, focusing on how using the correct punctuation.

Entry Level 2: Writing: Audience and Purpose: The pupils develop an understanding of how to communicate information in words, phrases and simple sentences to varying audiences and purpose. Pupils will increase their accuracy when spelling words with silent letters and homophones.

Entry level 3/ Level 1: Spelling, punctuation and grammar. Writing: Purpose: Pupils will learn how to spell words used most often in work, study and daily life. Pupils to be introduced to unpronounced sounds, and be able to identify and spell words that contain them. They will learn how to write consistently and accurately in complex sentences, using paragraphs where appropriate. Pupils will learn how to use format, structure and language appropriate for audience and purpose. They will learn how to communicate information, ideas and opinions clearly, coherently and accurately. Pupils will learn how to make requests and ask relevant questions to obtain specific information in different contexts.

Maths

Ascot: Number, time and measurement: Pupils will continue to build on their knowledge and recollection of numbers. Pupils will learn how to tell the time using both analogue and digital clocks. Pupils will look at measure and the different ways of measuring objects.

Entry Level 1: Measure: Pupils will learn how to measure with increasing accuracy. They will learn the appropriate language associated with measuring.

Entry Level 2: Measure: The pupils will develop their understanding of weight and measure. Pupils will learn how to perform calculations involving length as well as calculating perimeter and the area of shapes. Pupils will also develop their understanding of capacity and mass. They will consider the equivalence of such units. Pupils will understand temperature gauges and how to interpret them.

Entry Level 3/ Level 1: Measures and Mensuration: Pupils will learn how to plot and interpret graphs of equations; they will learn how to convert units of measure. Pupils will learn how to investigate compound measures, and how to calculate the perimeter and area of rectilinear and compound shapes. Pupils will learn how to calculate the area of irregular shapes, and they will learn how to calculate the area and circumference of a circle. Pupils will learn how to calculate surface area and volume of solids; they will also learn how to use Pythagoras theorem in triangle theory. Pupils will learn how to use trigonometry to calculate missing sides and angles.

Science

Ascot: Functional personal care, How things work/ Problem solving: Pupils will learn about personal care looking specifically at fine motor skills, own personal routine, travel training, laundry, basic cooking skills and being able to shop for food. Pupils will also learn about problem solving. Pupils will learn about basic electricity and circuits. Pupils will learn how to make sure that food organisation in fridges and cupboards is safe.

WJEC Entry 2: Science and the Human Body: Pupils will learn the key functions of major body systems. They will investigate the health of individuals.

WJEC Entry 2: Health and Safety: Pupils will learn about health and safety and how to identify hazards and the risks that they pose. Pupils will understand how fire extinguishers work and the different purpose of extinguishers. Pupils will locate the equipment in school to use in case of fire. They will understand the procedures that need to be followed should a fire happen.

WJEC Entry 2 Food and Health: Food and Health Pupils will learn practical skills to make healthy meals /food items.

WJEC Entry 3: Science and the Human Body: Pupils will explore factors that increase the risk of ill health and describe actions that can be taken to maintain health. Pupils will carry out simple tests to obtain data on the health of individuals. Using the data pupils will be able to make conclusions about the health of individuals.

They will understand why sight tests are important and when they should be carried out. Lastly, they will consider what a healthy diet looks like and how to implement it.

Pupils will be encouraged to create their own sketch book with ideas and examples which they will use as aid to help them. Pupils will be able to show they can adapt work if needed giving reasons why.</p>	<p>Digital Media</p> <p>Entry Level 2/3: Creating an audio-visual sequence: Pupils will consider the shot types in a sequence and how they can be identified, from a range of tv and film genres. They will produce a shot list and then create a storyboard, for a sequence from a tv show or film. Pupils will create a script to be used within an audio-visual sequence. Pupils will experiment with sound effects in an editing package.</p>
