



Curriculum Map - Term 5

Trent Bridge

English

Poetry about nature: Pupils will be focusing on exploring poetry with a great focus on nature, they will explore the features used that express nature and discuss how the poems makes them feel. Pupils will work on creating their own poetry.

RE

What makes Easter a special time for Christians? Pupils will learn that Easter is a festival celebrated every year by Christians and is all about new life, they will learn that the story of Easter has both sad and happy parts to it.

Art/DT

Eat More Fruit and Vegetables: Pupils will investigate that different foods have different nutritional values, they will explore a range of fruit and vegetables. They will then apply their learning to design and make a salad.

Maths

Time and money: Pupils will learn the days of the week and months of the year. They will learn to draw and write the time, and understand the duration of time. Pupils will learn to recognise coins and notes of money value, being able to select and represent an amount of money. They will add money and find change from an amount.

Music

Singing voice: Pupils will learn how to use different voices and find their singing voice. They will focus on singing with others, and they will learn how to control pulse and rhythm. Pupils will also develop an awareness of phrase.

Geography

Our local area: Pupils will learn about human and physical features in their locality, they will learn how to use simple fieldwork & observational skills to study the surrounding environment in their locality. Pupils will learn about locality jobs, they will explore ways to change the local area.

Science

Healthy eating: Pupils will name different food and drinks consumed at breakfast time, learning which ones are the healthiest options. They will taste and explore different healthy options, applying their learning to design and create their own healthy breakfast.

PSHE/Relationship Education

Personal Responsibility: Pupils will develop an awareness of the people around them and of the wider community, and take responsibility for themselves and their belongings. Keeping safe and looking after myself: Pupils will learn about what body parts are private and when is it OK to let someone touch them and how to say 'no' if they don't want to be touched.

Computing

Word processing: Pupils will learn the position of the letters and symbols on a keyboard. They will recognise why the 'Home Keys' are important, and will learn how to use the mouse and keyboard together. Pupils will be encouraged to sit with the correct posture for typing.
